All supporting departments were also recognized for their cooperation and teamwork in making AWACS a successful program.



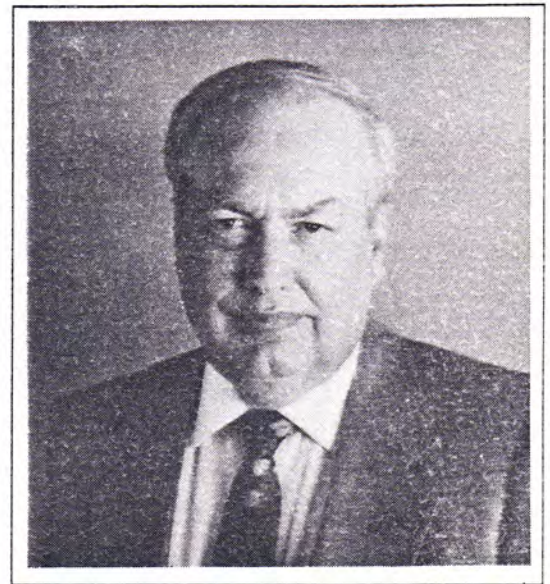

On September 19 the Mechanical Engineering Department began training their department personnel in how to design with Geometric Dimensioning and Tolerancing (GD&T) in accordance with the latest revision of ANSI Y 14.5-1982 as called for in DOD-STD-100. The eight one hour long classes are being taught by Denise Johnson of that department. The class material has been tailored for specific UTL applications and instead concentrates on GD&T rules, datum selection, the implications of machining operations, gaging/inspection, and tolerances of location using UTL drawings. The material presented will be on the practical application of GD&T as opposed to just teaching the GD&T contents.
